UNIFORM PREPARATION GUIDE



Name tapes with cadet last name. Sew on over pocket worn on right breast at an angle parallel to the pocket. A name tape is also sewn on the right rear pocket of your trousers. <u>Do not cut excess from ends of any tape, fold</u> <u>under to match width of pocket. Please do not use fabric glue!</u>



Pictured is the front of the blouse. IOWA CADETS branch tape is sewn over the pocket as shown, above the Eagle/Globe/Anchor. Opposite side is the name tape (referenced above).



Shown to the left is the name tape over right rear pocket of trousers.

MATCH COLORS of the tapes to the same color of uniform.

MARINES

Hard, plastic name plate is worn with service and dress uniforms. It is affixed 1/8" above the right pocket, parallel to the right blouse pocket. Note that each branch of service uses a different font and shape/size of plastic plate, so this must be the "Marine" variety. Qty = 1



New cadets will be issued three of the patches below. They are affixed to the left shoulder of the service alpha coat (pictured), the service bravo blouse (long sleeve khaki shirt), and the service charlie blouse (short sleeve khaki blouse.)



The Marine Cadets of Iowa patch is to be centered on the <u>left</u> sleeve the garment and sewn on at least $\frac{1}{2}$ " below but no more than 1" below the shoulder seam. Due to the shoulder structure and the shoulder pad in the service alpha coat, the patch on the service alpha coat should be 1" down from the seam.
